1. Monthly Letter ~ from the VP of Membership & Outreach (M&O)

Granted, we should all know our chapter director and president, but who puts together our weekly chorus newsletter/bulletin? Who continuously goes the extra mile? Who works behind the scenes for a successful show, gig or special chapter function? Who brings special treats every week for all to enjoy during break? Sure, most members don't do these things for recognition, but isn't it time to let the entire district know who these members are and that they are important to you and the success of your chapter? These questions also extend to our newest "Everyone in Harmony" members.

A SIMPLE SHOUT-OUT: Not comfortable yet but still want to acknowledge a member, how about a simple **Shout-Out!**

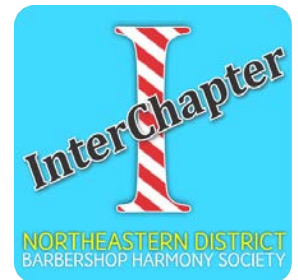


That's right, nothing fancy, just a simple acknowledgment of a member making a difference in your chapter. To do this I will need the following information:

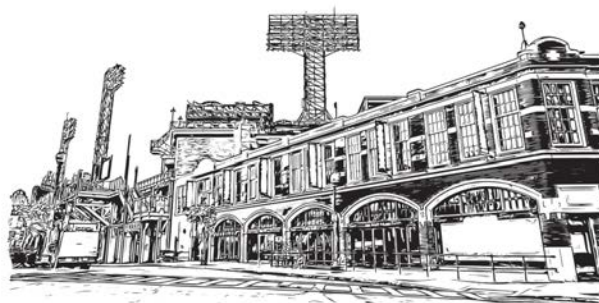

It was a gorgeous day with temperatures close to 90°. We arrived at the Red Sox offices and finally met, in person,, Mary Jane Ryan. Mary Jane had been extremely helpful over the phone and seemed very interested in our having a part in the ceremony. She took time from her busy duties at the Public Relations office to introduce us to Mr. Gene Kirby, Administrative Vice President of the Boston Red Sox. He was equally cooperative and patient as he accompanied us onto the hallowed grounds of Fabulous Fenway Park. I'm sure **Dick Young**, music director, and **Mike Foss**, shared the sane thrilling feeling that I did as we strolled out onto the outfield behind second base.

There we met the head groundskeeper, Joe Mooney, and the head electrician, Bob Ricci. We discussed our list of questions while the warm sun beat down upon us. We wandered across the field to the area around home plate.

It was there that the Chorus would line up to perform for the Bean Town fans. During our trip, we visited the office of Channel 38 WSBK TV and talked briefly with Mr. Dick Beach. We also called the Boston Globe to discuss a pending news release. It was a day to remember, and the BIG DAY was only a week away.



While everything seemed to be going along smoothly, there were two very real problems. The weather on April 7th was one. What would we do if the game was postponed? We agreed not to think about that one until we had to, we just hoped for the best.

The other problem began to bother us. During our visit to the park, it was learned that there was a two and one half second delay in the time it would take the sound of our voices to travel from the loud speakers on the outfield walls, to where we would be standing.

It was a serious problem. Feedback into the microphones concerned us also. Previous entertainers had encountered a great deal of difficulty during their performances. One time, members of a band put their instruments down in disgust. They could not cope with the echo. Soloists have had to wear devices over their ears so that they would not hear the delayed sound of: their own voice. We could not do that. We must hear each other in order to remain in tune. At our clubhouse rehearsal on March 30th, we tried, without success, to simulate this problem.

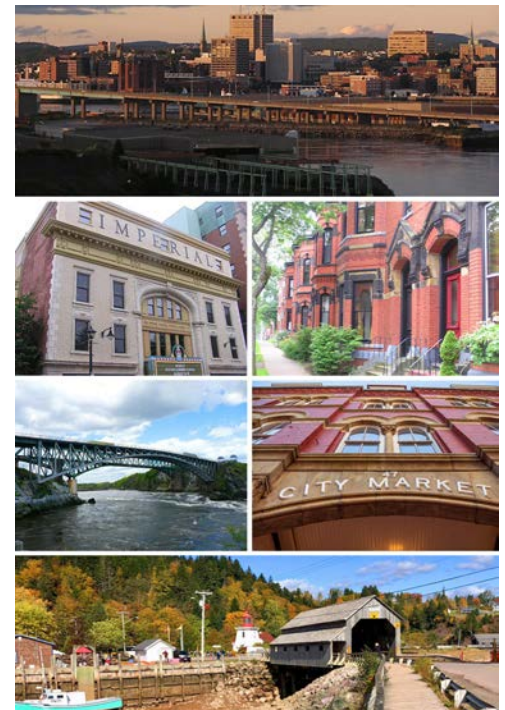

3. 75th Anniversary Fall Convention News ~ by Ed Fritzen

The **75th Anniversary Fall Convention team** has been working for what it seems like forever, planning for this Fall's District Convention and Contests in Saint John, New Brunswick. As you all know, **registration** for the convention has been open since June. Quartets and choruses are also able to **enter** the contests. This is far earlier than we normally are able to do this and the convention team was hoping that people would take advantage of being able to register earlier. It really helps the convention team with planning for the convention to have a good idea of how many people we can expect. So, if you have already registered for the convention and your quartet or chorus has already entered the contest, **THANK YOU!** For those who have not registered, there is still plenty of time to take advantage of the early bird rates. If you're still somewhat undecided about attending the convention, here are a few facts that might help you make up your mind.



1. Based on the most recent data, COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths have been declining recently in the New Brunswick area. There are no COVID-19 restrictions in place at this time. Masks are not required and there are no limits on the size of gatherings. This is all good news. The District is requiring that all convention registrants show proof of vaccination. We are striving to make this a safe convention for all attendees.
2. **Saint John, NB** is not really that far from the rest of the NED. It's only 410 miles from Boston, 495 miles from Hartford, 560 miles from Albany and 450 miles (730 km) from Montreal. It's easily a days drive from anywhere within the NED.
3. **Saint John** is truly a destination city with rich history, fine restaurants and breweries. The exchange rate as of Aug 25 is favorable \$1.00 USD = \$1.29 CAD. We are currently scheduling a tour of the city as well as a "pub" tour on Friday. Details should be announced shortly.
4. There will be two great contests featuring the finest quartets and choruses from throughout the NED. Not only will we be having our regular District Quartet and Chorus championships, in all of the new categories, (male, female, mixed), we will also be crowning the **Sunrise Division Champions** in all categories. There could be as many as 22-25 quartets and 21-25 choruses.
5. In continuing with the Sunrise Division tradition, we will have a district wide convention **banquet** following the contests on Saturday evening.
6. Couldn't get to Harmony University this year? We'll have our own "mini" HU on Friday morning and afternoon of the convention week. Instructors include **Joe Cerutti, Eric Ruthenberg, Mark Kettner, Dan Falcone, Rob Mance, David and Sandy Wright, Stef Schmidt, Steve Scott and Steve Tramack**. Course descriptions will be available soon on our website.
7. We have some very special guests for the weekend. The **2019 International Quartet Champions, Signature** will be with us for the weekend. They will be doing outreach activities to the local schools on Friday and



will be featured on our **Show of Champions**, Saturday night after the banquet.

Also joining us for the weekend will be BHS CEO **Marty Monson** and his wife **Amy**.

8. Did I mention the Show of Champions? Following the banquet on Saturday night we will have a "Show of Champions" featuring past NED Quartet champions as well as our guest **Signature**.
